3 MINUTE THESIS (3MT)

- First 3MT was held at University of Queensland
- Present a story of your research/thesis and its importance in only 3 minutes
- I static slide no animations/transitions
- Tailored to the general audience



IMPORTANCE OF 3MT IN CBI

- Showcase your research and presentation skills
- Demonstrate that you can cater your research to a broad audience of people who know nothing about it
- 3MT competitions at conferences
 - chance to win prizes
 - Good thing to put on CV
- Good practice for networking

UMD Three-Minute Thesis Competition

The Three-Minute Thesis (3MT) Competition challenges students to communicate the significance of their research projects to a non-specialist audience in just THREE MINUTES! The University of Maryland Graduate School invites graduate students from all disciplines to compete in the annual 3MT Competition.

The first round will be a video competition and occurs during the month of March 2026.

The final round will be in-person, and is scheduled on April 15, 2026 from 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. at the Stamp Student Union, in the Charles Carroll Room (second floor).


Participation in the 3MT competition provides students with:

- Experience in presentation skills and public speaking
- ▶ Better perspective about how their research fits into the larger picture
- ▶ An opportunity to showcase their work to colleagues and prospective employers
- ▶ Networking opportunities with students and faculty on campus
- Recognition and prizes

DRAFTING YOUR 3MT


- Keep audience in mind
 - Avoid scientific/academic jargon
 - Explain important concepts of your research
- Tell a story
 - Have beginning, middle and end
 - Tie your end back to the beginning
 - Try to be as concise as possible
- Have a clear outcome in mind
 - What do you want audience to take away from your talk

OTHER TIPS FOR DRAFTING 3MT

- Treat your 3MT like a commercial and sell your work
 - Begin with a good hook to catch people's attention
 - This can be comical or catchy
 - Keep people on the line throughout your talk
 - Don't be afraid to use some humor to keep audience interest
- Using analogies instead of scientific jargon to help a general audience understand your research
- Tell your research as a story
 - Have a clear beginning, middle, and end
 - Circle back to the beginning when ending your talk
- Break up your work into more digestible pieces for audience



SETTING UP SLIDE

- Many different ways to set up slide
- Make sure your slide is easy to walk through
 - Consider numbering different portions so audience knows where to look while you are presenting
- Try to keep slide as concise and clean as possible
- Only use short phrases where needed
 - Text heavy 3MT slides will be distracting as the audience will read it instead of listening to what you are saying



TIPS FOR CREATING 3MT SLIDE

- Keep as general and simple as possible
 - Avoid having complex or confusing images or figures
 - Avoid having too much stuff on the slide but at the same time avoid having too little
- When inputting figures, consider resizing text/legends and/or reworking figures to simplify it
- Color coding information on slide where you can
 - Use color blind friendly palletes
 - Keep contrast in mind while doing this
 - Use same family of colors (pastel, neon, etc.)
- Use lossless image so images don't get fuzzy/grainy when blown up

TIPS FOR CREATING 3MT SLIDE CONT.

- If you are a person who finds it easier to remove things, put everything on slide first and then cut down
- If you are a person who finds it easier to add things to slide, only input most important things first and then gauge
- Reinforce major ideas on the slide so you don't forget to mention it
- Make multiple slides and keep them in the same slide deck
 - Can help to pick your favorite or the most optimized version
 - Show your progression through the years

3MT SCRIPT

- Talk about each section for ~1 min (background, what you are doing, results)
- Start your talk off with a hook (Imagine...., Start with question, etc.)
- Pace talk slow and don't be afraid to add pauses into your 3MT
 - Pauses after talking about main points can help with audience understanding
- Use analogies to help audience understand your research better

PRACTICE

- After your slide is set up, practice going though your 3MT on your own and time yourself
 - Don't be harsh on yourself if you are over 3 minutes, often times you talk quicker when you present
- Practice with close friends (including non-scientists) and get feedback from them
- Implement 3MT into group meetings with your lab and practice them yearly or biyearly
- If possible, try projecting your slide prior to presenting your 3MT
 - Gauge if figures are visible

OTHER TIPS FOR PRACTICING 3MT

- Record yourself then listen back
- If you're practicing and you keep forgetting to mention a certain point, put it somewhere on the slide as a reminder
- Ask other people for their opinions on your 3MT
 - It's better to get feedback one on one or in a smaller group rather than a larger group
 - This can also help to alleviate some stress
